## Remember our Veterans this November 11--the national Veterans Day

**1944-**-There were 15,000 men and women from Fayette County serving in our Armed Forces. At home, many had little flags in house windows indicating that someone in that house was currently serving in the military. Some had blue stars, and others were gold indicating that that household had lost a loved one while serving. Fayette County lost 639 in the World War II conflict.

1965-1972--During the Vietnam War, there were 49 from Fayette County killed with 1 Missing in action.

1933--Dunkard Creek Bridge contract to be let(\$90,000) including the approach and the bridge proper.

**1934**--Local business, the McClain Sand Co. is one of three companies that will furnish an average of 80 cars of sand daily for the supplies needed on the government dam proposition at Grafton, WV.

1936--New ordinance--no parking on the north side of Main Street.

1942--Mapel Sterling Mine to re-open--will employ 100 men.

1948--Democratic candidate Harry Truman wins in Point Marion.

1951--No color printing in the newspaper-everything is in black and white.

1957--Nov. 7--Lee Chevrolet sponsors an art poster contest for Point Marion High School art students

.\*American Legion holds bingo in St. Hubert Church's social room until their new home is completed.

\*Pittsburgh Mercantile Co. store of Bobtown offers a 24" screen television console for \$269

.\*Point Marion Auto Co. will display a 1958 Ford. A door prize of a \$239 GE clothes dryer will be given (in cooperation with Klein's Dept. Store)

Nov. 14--Police Chief Bill Moser stated that a crackdown on traffic violators is going to continue.

\*Headlee Lumber Co. of Dilliner is across the toll free bridge. Call Raymond 5-5183 for information on building materials.

\*Point Marion Bank is one of ten that Gallatin National Bank has in Fayette County.

\*Valley Mercury Sales in Dilliner by the Dunkard Bridge has the new 1958 Mercury.

Nov. 26--Plans for a new AG Jointure High School and an addition to Masontown High School are progressing to the final stage and hoping to be ready by the 1959 school term.

\*West Penn Power Co. will provide free electricity for community Christmas lighting again this year.

\*About 100 residents of Smithfield protest the selection of Friendship Hill as the site for a new High School. They want the school built in Smithfield at a site donated by Smithfield Borough.

1961--The Volunteer Fire Company will have a banquet to celebrate the burning of the mortgage on the fire hall

**1965**--Nov. 4--Albert Gallatin High School football team -the Colonials-won their 8th consecutive game. They beat Redstone High

School 18-12. This was the first and only game to be played at the Point Marion field. An earlier contest at Point Marion field was canceled due to the death of Coach John Lozar. Gene Franks, Jr. then became acting head coach.

1958 Mercury.

\*Point Marion Police distributed literature in grade schools sponsored by the FBI to combat child molesters. Nov. 11--Point Marion's street work to cost \$23,662. \*A & P Grocery Store gives plaid stamps with each purchase. Most meats are under \$.50 per lb. Oranges are 18 to a bag for \$.89. Nassar's in Dilliner gives green stamps.

Nov. 18--The 10th annual Jay Dry Award banquet to be held at Burchinal's Ranch Restaurant on Rt. 119 North between Point Marion and Smithfield. The Albert Gallatin football team honors the outstanding seniora trophy and a \$50 saving bond is given. Sponsors are the Point Marion and Masontown Veteran of Foreign Wars.

\*The Colonials conclude their football season undefeated and united. They had their 9th straight victory over German, AG 33-German 7.

Nov. 24--Honor Roll for first quarter at Kolb Memorial High School in Masontown includes three from Point Marion.

Stewart's Laundromat is located on Water Street.

\*Roye's Photo Studio on upper Penn St. offers 25 photo Christmas cards for \$2.58 (with your negative).

**1975**--Groundbreaking ceremony was held in Morgantown for the start of construction for the new Monongalia General Hospital.

1979--The Point Marion News will begin publishing on Mondays instead of the traditional Thursdays.

**1985--**Nov. 5--Every year, we need to remember the flood that hit our town. Hurricane Juan caused the Monongahela River to rise to 19.0 feet by 10:00 p.m.

1986--Pittsburgh's Channel 4-WTAE--returns to Point Marion, one year later, to reflect on the flood disaster. 1999--The Fire Department announces that Sunday, November 28th is the official light up night of the new Christmas lights.
